Musical Notes for Today

Guide Me, O Thou Great Jehovah was written by William Williams (1717-1791), born in Carmarthenshire, Wales, who interweaves imagery from the Old Testament book of Exodus to evoke a sense of God's guidance through strife.

The Lone Wild Bird by Henry Richard McFayden who is quoted in the Presbyterian Hymnal Companion in 1993 saying, "The hymn was written on a quiet Sunday afternoon in the fall or winter of 1925...," Arranged by organist, composer and teacher David Johnson (1922-1987), we hear these words today: *The lone, wild bird in lofty flight is still with you, nor leaves your sight. And I am yours! I rest in you, Great Spirit, come, rest in me, too.*

"O Sacrum Convivium" is a Latin text honoring the Sacrament. It is included as an antiphon to the Magnificat in the vespers of the liturgical office on the feast of Corpus Christi. The text is attributed to Saint Thomas Aquinas and its sentiments describe the meal as a banquet: "O sacred banquet at which Christ is received, the memory of his Passion is recalled, our souls are filled with grace, and the pledge of future glory is given to us." Composer James Biery has been awarded for his compositions in every year since 2006 by the ASCAP (American Society for Composers and Publishers).

Fughetta in G Minor was composed *by Georg Andreas Sorg*e (March 21, 1703 in Mellenbach, Thuringia – April 4,1778) an organist, composer, and theorist. His references to Johann Sebastian Bach show that they were friends. Sorge composed three fugues for organ on the name BACH (BWV Anh.107, 108 and 110). He joined Lorenz Christoph Mizler's Corresponding Society of Musical Sciences in 1747, a month after Bach himself.

Change My Heart, O God

Educator, counselor, administrator, musician, worship leader, composer, and producer, Eddie Espinosa (b.1953) was raised a Catholic but made a profession of faith in the United Methodist Church in 1969. Soon afterward, he attended a Dave Wilkerson Youth Rally and experienced Andraé Crouch "taking people into the presence of God." At that point, he understood his calling (Westermeyer, 2010, p. 674 cited in *Canterbury Dictionary*,

Fernando Ortega is a classically trained pianist, singer, songwriter, and worship leader, who grew up in New Mexico near the Rio Grande. He is the product of eight generations of family hailing from Chimayo, New Mexico. *Aaron's Blessing*, based on the Scriptural blessing in Numbers 6:24-26 the final song of the album entitled, "Come Down, O Love Divine", in which he invites the listener to journey into a place of reflection and worship of God.
