

Musical Notes for Today

Where the Music Comes From by Lee Hoiby was born in Wisconsin and grew up a piano prodigy as a child. He began playing the piano at the age of 5. He earned his Bachelor of Music at the University of Wisconsin in 1947, when the university was a haven for musicians fleeing World War II Europe. He subsequently studied at Mills College until completing his Master of Music in 1952. *Where the Music Comes From* has a playful piano accompaniment and singable melody that makes this classic song fun to sing and special to perform.

"When the Poor Ones" (Cuando el Pobre) includes the lyrics, *"When the poor ones who have nothing share with strangers, when the thirsty water give unto us all, when the crippled in their weakness strengthen others, then we know that God still goes that road with us."* Little is known about José Antonio Olivar and Miguel Manzano, Roman Catholic priests from Spain who collaborated on this text. They reflect the spirit of the 1970s when the Catholic Church was beginning to explore congregational singing and when liberation theology was rising in its influence. Translator G. Lockwood served as a missionary to Costa Rica and collaborated on nine English translations of Spanish-language hymns for *The UM Hymnal*.

Change My Heart, O God

Educator, counselor, administrator, musician, worship leader, composer, and producer, Eddie Espinosa (b.1953) was raised a Catholic but made a profession of faith in the United Methodist Church in 1969. Soon afterward, he attended a Dave Wilkerson Youth Rally and experienced Andraé Crouch "taking people into the presence of God." At that point, he understood his calling (Westermeyer, 2010, p. 674 cited in *Canterbury Dictionary*)... to ministry.

A Legend by Peter Tchaikovsky. "Legend (The Crown of Roses)", Op. 54, No. 5, is a composition by Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky, originally written as a song for solo voice and piano in 1883. The text describes the child Jesus growing the roses that would later provide the thorns for his crown, and the song is often sung at both Christmas and Easter.

Fernando Ortega is a classically trained pianist, singer, songwriter, and worship leader, who is the product of eight generations of family hailing from Chimayo, New Mexico.
"Ortega's approach to music includes elements of folk, classical, Celtic, Latin American, world, and rustic hymnody," according to Wikipedia. *Aaron's Blessing*, based on the Scriptural blessing in Numbers 6:24-26 the final song of the album entitled, "Come Down, O Love Divine", in which he invites the listener to journey into a place of reflection and worship of God.
